for the first week in July. Paddock bulls were all sold in the same week as well. For a full sale report, please visit the ALC Brahman's web site www.alcbrahmans.com.au

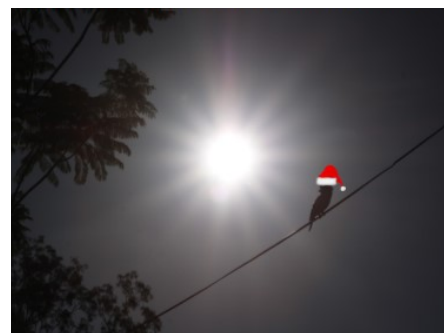
We had a record number of calves branded for 2017. The calf numbers have been a combination of our cow herd continually working harder and our yearling mat-

ing program being a great success. This year we used IVF to speed up our genetic gain. The selected few donor cows were ALC breeders with better than -10 DTC EBV and +2.0 SS EBV, who'd had more than 3 calves in the first 60 days of calving. At ALC it is important for all females to produce a calf under natural mating conditions therefore OPU appealed to us. All donors will produce a naturally conceived calf in S'19 as well as IVF calves through recipient cows. We are looking forward to these results next year!

Cattle prices have been strong throughout the year and even with a slight correction in the later half, it remains in good shape. This has allowed us to get some extra property improvements done ahead of time, such as regrowth control, fencing and water infrastructure. With all the children home from boarding school, we are enjoying our time together and plenty of work is getting completed. Calving has finished, all cows who failed to calve have been sent to the meatworks, branding is almost completed and we have even got a horse broken in. Raising a family doing something we all love is something we are very thankful for.
